# Memphis-Tennessee





## Why Memphis-Tennessee?

Memphis, Tennessee, is perched up on the eastern banks of the Mississippi River, giving rise to its old nickname of the "Bluff City". It's a city rich in history and culture, and almost everywhere you go, you'll hear music in the air. ### Facilites

When you consider taking a travel nursing job, one of your first priorities may be choosing the type of healthcare facility where you want to work. For example, if you've been working at a large teaching hospital, you might want to pursue travel nursing assignments in similar types of facilities.

(Word to the wise: <u>Graceland</u> was narrowly edged out and didn't make this list, but that doesn't mean you shouldn't go see the Jungle Room for yourself.)

#### **1** Barbecue

No one is more passionate (and opinionated) about barbecue than the people of Memphis. Everyone has a favorite barbecue spot, and they'll be happy to tell you why it's the best one ever and you must try it out right away. And since Memphis is packed with barbecue joints, that'll keep you busy for a while. Our recommendation: start with Central Barbecue and the Bar-B-Q Shop. Others will put in a plug for the Rendezvous, a historical spot in downtown Memphis that's famous for its dry-rub ribs, or the Commissary in Germantown. (Pro tip: Memphis-style means slow-cooked and smoked, usually but not always pork, and available with sauce ("wet) or without sauce "dry.")

#### Beale Street

Beale Street is Memphis' answer to Bourbon Street in New Orleans: drinks, eats, music, and spectacle. Grab some barbecue and beer at Rum Boogie Café or Blues City Cafe, listen to music at B.B. King's Blues Club, and shop for Memphis memorabilia and vintage treasures at A Schwab, a store that defies easy explanations. In nice weather, you can also catch a free outdoor concert at W.C. Handy Park (look for the iconic statue). And if you want to go old school, drop by for a deep-friend hamburger at Dyer's Burgers (just don't ask too many questions about how they're cooked).



#### **3** Big River Crossing

At nearly a mile long, <u>Big River Crossing</u> is the longest public pedestrian bridge spanning the Mississippi River. That's right, you can actually walk (or bike!) across the entire Mighty Mississippi. And you should: the view alone is unparalleled. Plus, you can impress your friends with pictures of yourself "in the middle of the Mississippi River."

#### 4 Burke's Books


If you love a good independent bookstore, make time to go browse at <u>Burke's Book Store</u>, home to an eclectic selection of new, used, and rare books, including many books by Southern authors. And since you'll be in Memphis for at least a few months, there's a good chance you can catch a famous author who has dropped by for a reading and autograph session.

#### Crosstown

A few generations ago, the <u>Crosstown Concourse</u> building was home to a Sears Roebuck and distribution center—and you'll still hear a few older Memphis refer to the converted facility that way. (Just as a heads up in case someone gives you directions that way.) Today, however, Crosstown Concourse is a vertical village of restaurants, pubs, galleries, artists' workshops, a brewery, a 417-seat black box theater, and more. Some people even live in apartments there! Plan a visit to catch some live music, see a play, try the amazing cuisine at the Global Café, or hear a talk from one of the resident artists.

#### 6 Local Breweries and Taprooms

Memphis may be famous for barbecue and blues but add another "B" to that list: breweries. Check out <u>Grind City Brewing</u>, which has a large outdoor space for hanging out, <u>Wiseacre Brewing</u>, or <u>Hampline Brewing Company</u> (p.s. trivia night is big at Hampline). If you go to one of the taprooms for <u>Ghost River Brewing Co</u>, try a beer named after the Zippin Pippin, the old wooden roller coaster at the old Memphis amusement park Libertyland.





#### Muddy's Bake Shop

Are you in a peanut butter pie mood, or do you feel more like a blueberry crumble? Red velvet cupcake or grasshopper cupcake? Jammy bars with sweet apricot preserves or key lime pie? Local favorite Muddy's Bake Shop in the Broad Ave Arts District has a rotating array of treats to tempt you. Or for more interactive fun, grab a few new friends or coworkers and take a baking class. More of a classic donut person? Head on out to East Memphis and check out Gibson's Donuts, a Memphis institution since it opened in the late 1960s.

#### **8** National Civil Rights Museum

People come from all over the county to visit the <u>National Civil Rights</u> <u>Museum at the Lorraine Motel</u>. Located at the site of the assassination of the civil rights leader Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., the museum offers the chance to learn more about the struggle for civil rights in the United States—and how that movement has shaped the drive for freedom and equality around the world. The museum offers a historic collection of memorabilia, interactive exhibits, films, and speakers to provide a topnotch educational experience that you'll recommend to others.

#### The Peabody Hotel

The Peabody Hotel is a beautiful old hotel in the heart of downtown Memphis. But that's not why its famous—and that's not why you need to visit. No, the reason you need to visit the Peabody is this: the Peabody Ducks. Every day at 11 a.m., a family of ducks march proudly through the lobby to the majestic fountain, and every afternoon at 5 p.m., they march back to the elevator to return to their home, the Royal Duck Palace on the rooftop. Speaking of the rooftop, you should make it a point to catch a Rooftop Party and watch the sun set over the Mississippi; the Peabody hosts one of the best parties in town on its roof on Thursday nights from April to August.





#### 10 The Pyramid

Next to the giant M-shaped bridge over the Mississippi River that connects Tennessee with Arkansas, the giant shiny silver pyramid is probably the most famous part of the Memphis skyline. The Pyramid is currently home to a giant <u>Bass Pro Shops</u>, as well as a pistol and archery range, a bowling alley, a 103-room hotel, and two restaurants. And yes, you can take an elevator up 28 stories to the very tip-top of the pyramid and gaze out over the city.


#### Shelby Farms

Shelby Farms is much beloved among Memphians, but out-of-towners might not be as familiar with it. Here's your official notice: Shelby Farms Park is a must-visit spot during your travel nursing assignment in Memphis! Located just east of town, this scenic public park is one of the largest urban parks in the country. It's also home to Shelby Farms Stables, if you're eager to go horseback riding, as well as opportunities for kayaking, canoeing, paddleboarding, and fishing. The Shelby Farms Greenline is a fantastic place to run, bike, walk, or just meander, and it's open 365 days a year (hint: no matter when you have time off, you can find something to do here).

#### Sun Studio

If you're a first-time visitor to town, you've probably got Elvis on your mind. Book yourself a tour of <u>Sun Studio</u>, which bills itself as "the birthplace of rock and roll," and see the very spot where the King recorded his very first album. Other rock and roll and blues greats who recorded at Sun Studio include B.B. King, Jerry Lee Lewis, Roy Orbison, and Johnny Cash. And if music is your passion (besides nursing, of course), you can even <u>book some time in the recording studio</u> there yourself.


